We had an aggressive Cruise schedule planned for 2019 but due to many unforeseen circumstances did not actually go on as many as planned. We started out well with a terrific Oyster Roast at Sea Harbor Yacht Club hosted by Will and Beth Martin that was very well attended. The Neuse River Shakedown following was hosted by Eric and Mary Ann Lind and was wonderful but only two boats attended.

The Dock and Dine at Beaufort hosted by Roger and Leslie Hammer had a good turnout of five boats with prospective members Rick & Sue Fears, Rich & Shirley Richter, and members Ron & Sharon Scotti enjoying an easy trip down the ICW to Town Creek Marina and a terrific meal at the City Kitchen Restaurant.

The Ann and Charles Stackhouse, along with Joanna Harrell and Carl Franklin hosted the Steakout in May, which was enjoyed by over 20 members. Both the Fears and Righters made the trip by boat to complete there cruise requirements for membership. Commodore Roger Hammer presented them with their SCOO Burgees.

The spring cruise to Charleston that was so well planned by John Coombs had to be cancelled as so many boats had to drop out because of various circumstances. The Cape Lookout Cruise and the Full Moon Rendezvous were also cancelled due to inclement weather for the former and excessive heat for the latter. A trip to Ocracoke, quickly organized by Dale and Debbie Montgomery to replace the cancelled Cape Lookout trip ended up being the best attended trip of the season with 12 couples making the 40 mile trip across the sound including Taylors on PELICAN, Guilfoyles on MERIDIAN, Righters on MY OLIVE, Behres on JORUM, Carbones on JUPITER, Luhs on BLUEJACKET, Fears on MISS ADVENTURE, Steve Moser & Kim Walton on SPINDRIFT, McCraws on SOJOURN, Smiths on EXCALIBER, and Van Gampers on KORY.

The Annual Picnic held at Arlington Place, was enjoyed by over 40 members. The Dinghy Poker Run, held jointly with NSA and ODC, was a lot of fun and raised over \$7,000 for sailing scholarships. Some of the dinghies could have cruised the ocean!

The River Dunes Dock & Dine, hosted by Roger and Leslie Hammer, ended up being a Dine only event due to severe thunderstorms. Once again, the chef at River Dunes Club House Restaurant did a superb job. Behres, Fears, Gloriosos, Linds, Rupperts, Smalls, Smiths, and Sam Alitto attended the dinner.

I was supposed to captain the Whichever Way the Wind Blows but my jib furler had to be replaced and we couldn't find another volunteer for the event. But then we had the Oriental Cup, again held jointly with NSA and ODC, and there were 21 boats participating.

SCOO cruised to Bath, NC, then to Washington, NC in September. We had five boats cruising, the Martins on s/v MARTINIQUE, the Gloriosos on s/v OUT OF THE BLUE, the Van Gampers on s/v KORY, Hans Nickstadt on s/v LULU, and the Behres on s/v JORUM. The marina at Bath had been damaged by hurricane Dorian, but they fitted us in with power, but no water. We enjoyed walking through the historic town and observing local folks demonstrating 18th century crafts. We dined at Blackbeard's pizza and Italian restaurant that provided live music each night.
